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Franka Miriam Brueckler is assistant professor at the Department of Mathematics of the University of Zagreb. She obtained her PhD degree in pure mathematics (thesis “Additions to the theory of Hilbert  $C^*$ -modules and operator spaces”, 2002), but after the PhD her interests shifted to math education, particularly university level teaching mathematics to non-mathematicians, to history of mathematics and to applications of mathematics to chemistry. Since 1997 she is active in popularization of mathematics and the sciences. Since 2009 she is a member of the Committee for Raising Public Awareness of Mathematics of the European Mathematical Society, whose vice-presidents she recently became. She held more than 45 public and popular talks, more than 60 workshops, twice she performed in a popular stage play, published two popular mathematics books, and appeared in five educational broadcasts of the national television. She won the prize of the state of Croatia for popularization of science for the year 2009. She published 8 research papers and about 80 professional and popular articles, and had about 30 conference presentations, including three invited lectures (on popularisation of mathematics) and an invited conference course (on mathematical crystallography). Since 2007 she is the chief researcher of the project “Mathematical foundations of scientific and social insights”, funded until November 2012 by the Ministry of Science, Education and Sports of Croatia. In her teaching career she also worked at the Dept. of Mathematics of the Univ. of Osijek (1997–2010) and Zagreb School of Economy and Management (2002–2010). She taught various courses, of which for the longest time “Mathematics 1 and 2 for chemistry students” (<http://prelog.chem.pmf.hr/~fmbruckler/>) in Zagreb (since 2006) and “History of mathematics” in Osijek (1999–2010). She published two textbooks (“History of mathematics I and II”), supervised more than 30 graduation theses, and co-supervised one PhD thesis in math education (“Teaching and learning outcomes in undergraduate calculus courses for students of technical and science studies in Croatia and Denmark”, Ljerka Jukić, 2011). In the period 2005–2007 she was a member of the Executive Committee of the Croatian Science Foundation and in the period 2006–2008 she was the vice-dean for teaching affairs of the Dept. of Mathematics in Zagreb. She is a member of the Croatian Mathematical Society, Croatian Chemical Society and the Croatian Crystallographic Association.
